June 2020 Monthly Report Summary

Services of the Sheriff's Office

The Campbell County Sheriff's Office has two main divisions. The uniformed division based in the Campbell County Justice Center and the administrative division based in the Campbell County Administration Building. The Sheriff's Office provides courthouse security at the Justice Center during business hours. Deputies and Court Security Officers (CSOs) are present for all court proceedings ranging from arraignments to trials, Family Court and more.

Deputies and Court Security Officers are also responsible for transporting prisoners to and from court as well as from area detention centers to the Campbell County Justice Center and Campbell County Detention Center.

In the administrative division of the Sheriff's Office, services such as the collection of property taxes; management of process of service of papers; processing of Carrying Concealed Deadly Weapons (CCDW) Permits; Finger printing; and Vehicle Inspections are performed.

Please note that during the month of June some Kentucky State and County offices were still closed while others were in the process of determining how to re-open to the public. This caused various tasks of the Sheriff's Office to be somewhat altered in number. During the month of June Sheriff's office employees were still reporting to the Courthouse and County Administration Buildings for work daily and the administrative office of the Sheriff's Office was re-opened for in person business.

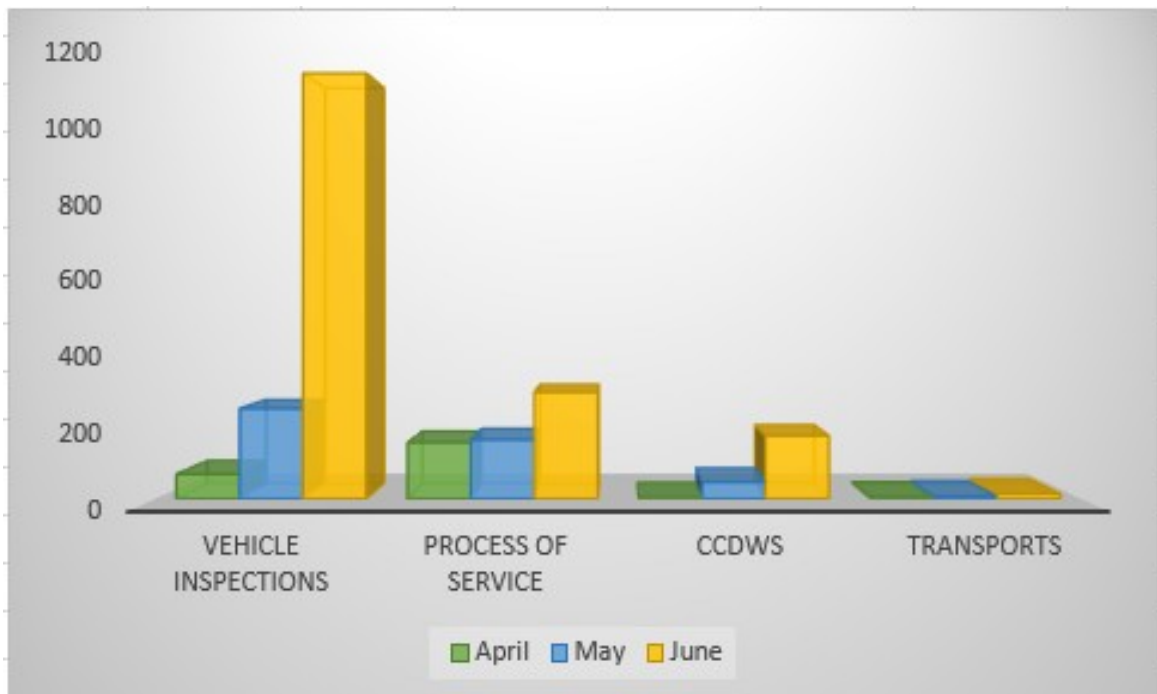
Deputies and Court Security Officers provide security for court hearings and trials as well as transport prisoners to and from court, from detention centers outside of Campbell County, to the Campbell County Detention Center, and to institutions such as the Eastern Kentucky Mental Health Hospital and the Kentucky Correctional Psychiatric Center (KCPC). During the month of June, due to pandemic safety measures implemented by Detention Centers, Deputies and CSO's made just one trip within the state of Kentucky to transport a prisoner to the Campbell County Detention Justice Center. This prisoner was picked up from the Grateful Life Rehabilitation Center in Erlanger, KY. Thirteen trips were made transporting prisoners from facilities outside of Kentucky to the Campbell County Justice Center and the Campbell County Detention Center. In the course of these trips Deputies traveled 3,122 miles outside of the state. Transports outside of Kentucky were made to Batavia, Chillicothe, Georgetown, Hamilton, Lancaster, Mansfield, and Marysville, Ohio. Trips were also made to Terre Haute, Indiana; Concord, North Carolina and Detroit, Michigan.

The Sheriff's Office also serves Warrants and issues Citations. During the month of June the Sheriff's Office served thirteen warrants and wrote four citations.

The Campbell County Sheriff's Office offers the service of assisting individuals who have locked their keys in their car. If a deputy is available he can meet the vehicle owner at the locked vehicle and assist in opening a door to retrieve the keys. During the month of June a deputy was able to assist one individual with retrieving their car keys.

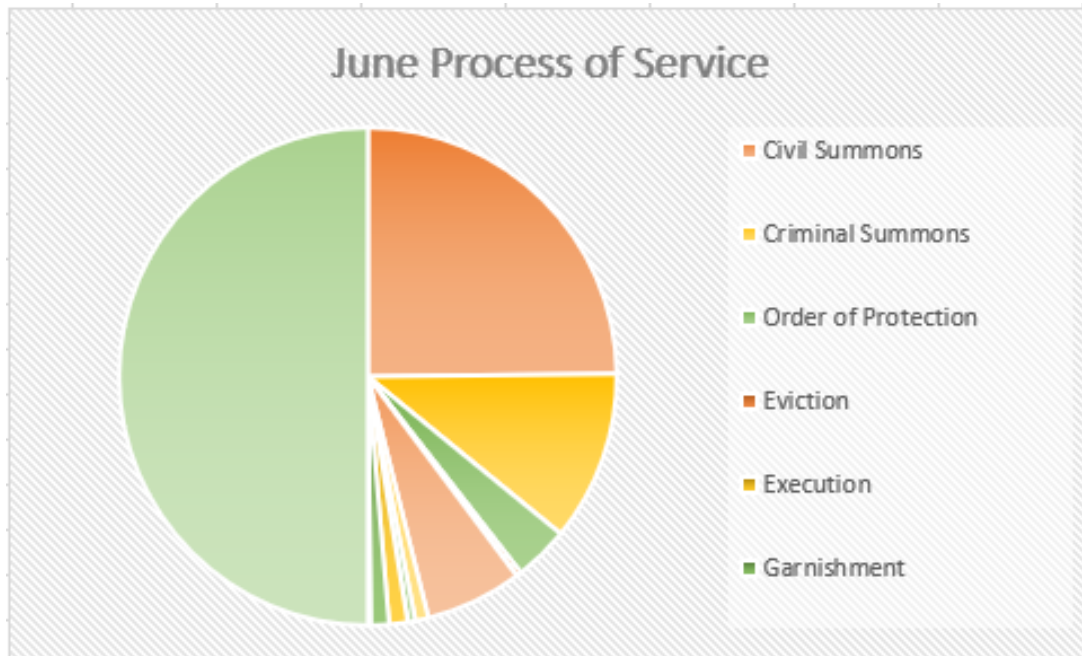
Services performed in the administrative offices of the Sheriff's Office include collection of property taxes; processing and service of process papers, these papers include civil and criminal summonses, subpoenas, evictions and various other document types; Carrying Concealed Deadly Weapons (CCDW) Permits; Finger printing; and Vehicle Inspections. Throughout the month of June the Campbell County Sheriff's Office processed 294 papers; processed 174 CCDW applications, renewals, requests for duplicate licenses, or changes of information; and performed 1,175 vehicle inspections both at the Sheriff's Office location and off site.

Three Month Comparison of Services Performed by the Campbell County Sheriff's Office



Nearly all services listed here experienced a decrease in activity during the months of April and May as the state of Kentucky attempted to address the Covid-19 pandemic. Upon the Sheriff's Office re-opening in June there was a sharp increase in several areas. In April only 68 inspections were performed. In May the number of vehicle inspections increased to 249, and then in June the number substantially increased with 1,175 inspections performed. The number of documents processed also began increasing during this time with 155 processed in April, 163 processed in May, and 249 documents processed in June. The number of CCDWs licenses processed ranged from 3 licenses processed in April, to 46 processed in May, then 174 licensed processed in June. The number of prisoner transports did not see as much fluctuation during this time with Deputies and Court Security Officers making 5 trips in April, 7 trips in May, and 13 trips in June.
